

A difficult co-worker that was causing distress was removed from the situation and relocated to another job. Rita was moved from a demeaning employer to an employer who is respectful and kind. A large tree miraculously missed hitting her home by only a few inches. She gave God complete credit for all these victories. She jubilantly told of God continually helping her rise higher in her walk with Him!

During her next visit, Rita told of being viciously attacked by a gang member who has been pursuing her for years. This happened inside her neighborhood convenience store. The gang member lives only four blocks from her and recognizes her car. I encouraged her to be extra vigilant in being aware of her surroundings and also urged her to keep all doors locked. She had not been in the habit of utilizing this practice. She kept repeating she was afraid for her life. We then joined our faith together in a powerful prayer of protection. She needed to grasp the idea that this gang member was no match to God's fierce shield of protection and His large warrior angels.

As soon as I greeted Rita on her most recent visit, her first words were "I have kept thinking about the 10 to 12 feet tall warrior angels and God that are constantly surrounding me!" She said this aspect of our last prayer has kept her going forward during seasons of fear and doubt. She said it made a lasting impression.

At times, we can all be overcome by fear. God's Word is our strong tower. The words of 2 Kings 6 ring true! "When the servant of the man of God got up and went out early the next morning, an army with horses and chariots had surrounded the city. 'Oh no, my Lord! What shall we do?' the servant asked."

"Don't be afraid," the prophet answered. "Those who are with us are more than those who are with them."

Hello from Pastor Ron:

This has been a very busy quarter at Manna House; we have had an average of about 60 clients every week and, of course, that represents many more people. We still have a lot of people in need of prayer. I had prayer with one lady whose son was in prison, and the son also has kidney failure and on dialysis while there. The son is in prison because of drug charges. The mother has to keep moving because of the threats by the drug dealers on her life to pay her son's debt for drugs. We often think that what we do only affects us personally but it often affects all those around us, as well. I had prayer with her and she said she would read her Bible and pray every day, and she left Manna House feeling much better about her situation.

I had prayer with another lady named Tammy who had a 47-year old daughter with cancer in her lungs, spinal column and liver and requested prayer for healing. We prayed for her, and she left with a much better feeling about her situation. We have a young lady that comes in about every month to get

We have a young lady that comes in about every month to get food and clothing and always needs prayer for things going on in her life. This particular time, the house they are renting is over run with bugs of all kinds and they even had a live possum in their kitchen cabinets. When they try to contact the landlord, he either does not return their call or listens to their complaint and does nothing at all. This lady just recently married and her husband has a decent job, but he is also a gambler and goes to the casino to gamble, and, recently, he went to the casino and gambled away all the money they had and they didn't even have the money to pay the rent when it came due. Sin still causes many difficult situations in peoples' lives. Remember when we were told if we would pass the gambling bill, it would create more revenue for our schools. If it has, I have not seen it and our schools are suffering today because of lack of money and our teachers are some of the lowest paid in the country.

We recently passed a bill to allow convenience store and super markets to sell cold beer and wine with higher percentage points of alcohol which will create more drunks on our streets and highways. They will drink these products on the way home if they are cold and ready to drink. We, as Christians, need to take our stand against these kinds of evils instead of voting for them.
